We were uncertain as to whether we would be able to hold the show again this year, but with the current plans for loosening restrictions, we felt that we would go ahead with planning for 14th August. The final decision to hold the show will of course, be dependant on Government advice closer to the date.

It has been a very trying time for many of us – but for those with a garden, allotment, small space for pots or even a window box, there has been some escape and the opportunity to watch Spring arrive and see plants beginning to flourish.

You will have noticed that there is a change of venue for 2021, which has come about due to the closure of the Methodist church and hall – which has served us well as the home of our Horticultural show and lunchtime concerts for many years. We would like to take this opportunity to thank the management for all their help and support over the years.

This year we will be using the Beechwood Centre – a community centre well known to many in the Fishponds area.

So, why not come along and join us – with or without an exhibit; the show is open to everyone and we hope you will find something of interest in the following schedule of classes. Entry forms are to be found in the centre of the schedule....the more exhibits we have – the better the show!

.....And the refreshments are pretty good too!!

RULES

- 1) Fruit, flower and vegetable exhibits (with the exception of the floral art classes) must have been grown by the exhibitor.
- 2) The Gill Coombe Salver and the David Elsbury Memorial trophy, remain the property of '**Activate**'. Winners of these trophies must undertake to return them 2 weeks prior to the next show.
- 3) The 'Activate' committee cannot accept responsibility for any loss or damage to exhibits or personal property during the show (including setting up and clearing away).
- 4) Vases for exhibits must be provided by the exhibitor.
- 5) No exhibitor may exhibit more than one entry in any one class. No two or more persons may exhibit produce from the same garden or greenhouse in any one class. A separate official entry form **must** be used for each exhibitor and entries **must** be as specified in the schedule.
- 6) Handicraft exhibits must **not** have been exhibited in previous years.
- 7) All entry forms with appropriate fee of 30p per exhibit to be RECEIVED BY Wednesday 11th August 2021.

(Entries accepted on day of show will be charged at 50p each and **must be submitted with a completed entry form between 09:15 and 10:15** – after which doors will be closed for judging)
- 8) Exhibits must be staged at the Beechwood Club, Beechwood Road, Fishponds between 09:00 and 10:30 on the morning of the show.
- 9) No exhibit shall be removed before 3:50pm

1	One single Rose
2	Spray of Floribunda roses
3	Three stems of Dahlias of one variety (Cactus, Ball, Pom or decorative)
4	One Gladiolus
5	Six Carnations or Dianthus
6	Three single Chrysanthemum heads (mixed colours allowed)
7	A vase of 5 stems, each one a different garden flower
8	A vase of contrasting foliage
9	A foliage pot plant (not to exceed 9" / 23cm) width
10	A vase of 5 stems of Sweet Peas.
11	One Cactus
12	One Succulent



VEGETABLES

- 13 Three Potatoes (any named variety)
- 14 Three Peppers (any colour or mix of colours)
- 15 Three Onions
- 16 Six dwarf French Beans
- 17 Four Runner Beans
- 18 Three Carrots (any variety)
- 19 Three Tomatoes (not Cherry type)
- 20 Eight Tomatoes (Cherry or small variety)
- 21 Two Courgettes (under 8" / 20cm)
- 22 Longest Runner Bean (judged on length only)
- 23 Pair of greenhouse Cucumbers
- 24 Three Leeks – including foliage and roots

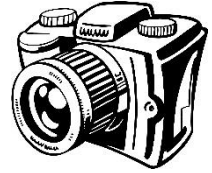

RECIPES

SPONGE CAKE (CLASS 33)

6oz / 170g Self raising flour
6oz / 170g Butter or margarine
6oz / 170g Caster sugar
3 Eggs
Jam for filling

Beat the butter and sugar together until pale and fluffy.

Add the eggs and mix well.

Fold in the flour.

Divide the mixture between 2x 7" (17.5cm) tins.

Bake at 180C / Gas mk4 for around 30 - 40 mins.

When cool, add the jam between the two sponges and decorate as you wish.

Display on paper or foil plate.

FRUIT CAKE (CLASS 35)

8oz / 227g Self raising flour
4oz / 113g Caster sugar
4oz / 113g Margarine
8oz / 227g dried mixed fruit
2 eggs
½ level tsp salt
1 tsp mixed spice

Add all the ingredients together and mix well. Add a drop of milk if necessary. Turn into a greased and lined 7" (17.5cm) tin.

Bake at 170C / Gas mk3 for around 1 – 1.5 hrs.

Display on paper or foil plate.

HINTS FOR EXHIBITING VEGETABLES

Potatoes	Uniform size and shape – medium size.
Onions	Do not rub off outer skins – just clean. Cut roots to about ½ " / 1.25cm. Tops can be tied down.
Leeks	Leave foliage on – can be tied. Trim roots.
Runner beans	Best not showing beans inside. Uniform size and shape is best.
Carrots	Avoid green tops
Tomatoes	Leave stalks on. Do not polish. Best without split skins.
